OCB Flexible Fund Grant: Targeted Consultation

The Retirement Research Foundation (RRF) supports the efforts of Chicago-area nonprofit organizations to improve management and governance and recognizes that nonprofit organizations may require outside expertise to address these areas.

Through RRF's OCB Flexible Fund, organizations may apply for Targeted Consultation. The Fund provides short-term, tailored technical assistance to address a capacity-related issue or an unanticipated change. The focus of a consultation is based on an organization's specific needs and interests. Examples may include: budgeting and accounting to accommodate cash flow challenges, human resource considerations for adjusted staffing, exploration of mergers or strategic collaborations, or other issues that would benefit from external expertise.

OCB Flexible Fund Grants are available to nonprofit organizations (located in Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, or McHenry County, Illinois) that provide services to the elderly and intentionally give a high priority to this population. The length of time for an OCB Targeted Consultation generally ranges from two to six months; the maximum grant amount is \$5,000.
